## COMMODORE'S REPORT

This is my first report after a year in office. To begin with I would like to say what a rewarding experience this year has been and how much I am indebted, not only to my predecessors in office, but to our Board of Directors and the committee members who have all contributed to make this past year one of the Club's best ever. Details on the activities are to be found in the individual director's reports to follow, but I would be remiss if I did not mention some of the highlights.

The tremendous weather, the number of new and old-time members using the islands, the success of the canteen, the junior programme, the number of boats racing and cruising, the number of GRYC sailors collecting silverware at away regattas, the success of our own regattas, the theme party and our other social events - all serve to show what we can and have done as a Club.

A special thanks to our staff, so ably led by Graeme. And I must give credit to the Gatineau Boom Company without whose co-operation and assistance easy access to the island would be impossible.

To make this a successful year your Club Executive has been extremely busy. As the club grows so does the work load and the responsibilities of your Board. You will remember that one of the first activities we undertook this year was to return the loans to some nine ex members who, on resignation, had so requested. I am happy to say that we have replaced this money twice over and I think psychologically this has been a great boost for the Club. During the past year we have renegotiated the mortgage agreement with the Royal Trust and, even in the face of rising interest rates, due to the special efforts of the finance committee, I believe we have been able to achieve a very fair mortgage rate.

Your Board of Directors has also felt that it is time for the Club to participate nationally in the Canadian Yachting Association and, on the provincial side, with the Quebec Sailing Association. With this in mind, we undertook to pay our assessments and several members attended the annual meeting last spring of CYA, held in Ottawa. At the invitation of Terry Phillips, Executive Director of the Canadian Yachting Association, I attended the CYA Educational Committee meeting on October 21-22, 1973. The results of this committee are now being published as a revised sailing and teaching format for instructors across Canada. Lastly, four members of your executive attended the annual meeting of the Quebec Sailing Federation in Montreal on November tenth, where we were especially welcomed.

I am looking forward to 1974 at GRYC. In closing, I would like to say a sincere thank you to the retiring board members who have so generously given of their time and who, by their work, have made 1973 a great year.

VICE-COMMODORE'S REPORT

The Junior Programme was again very active and successful this year and continues to build a strong nucleus of sailing talent within the Club as evidenced by the excellent performance of a number of our juniors in competition this season.

I would like to express my thanks and the thanks of the club members to those who helped to make the Junior Programme as good as it was. Irma Place, as Chairman of the Junior Committee, did an excellent job as did our instructing staff, including Graeme Parkinson, Club Manager and Chief Instructor, Dave Strutt, Chris Place and Dean Smith. We were fortunate this year in obtaining the services of Margaret Burke as swimming instructor. Margaret was highly recommended by the YM-YWCA and I'm sure those who were associated with her during the summer would agree with that recommendation. A special vote of thanks goes to the Weatherman this year for providing the best summer ever.

This is a total of 104 memberships out of a maximum allowable by By-Law of 300.

Deducting a total of 73 persons coming within the Retaining Membership category there were 256 "active" members in 1973.

These figures are given without further comment.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Your Board met eleven times during the twelve month period, two of the meetings being attended by the full Executive (Directors and Committee Chairmen).

Many decisions were made, a great many thoughts and ideas were expressed and thousands of words were mouthed. The average minutes covered six typed pages of 8½ x 11 paper.

A little secret - until now - through the courtesy of the Commodore, the 100th meeting of the Board was celebrated with champagne and an iced cake.

## ASSOCIATE MEMBERSHIP

Resulting from a motion at the 1972 Annual Meeting a new classification of membership, that of Associate, was introduced for the first time in 1973 as part of a two-year experiment. The purpose of this step was to make available a membership for those merely interested in the social activities of the Club and to have a place in the sun to swim and relax.

Twelve people took advantage of this offer and joined our Club. Perhaps the most surprising and gratifying side issue was the anticipated move that did not materialize. It was thought that a number of Seniors who do not normally sail and yet who pay full Senior fees would transfer to Associate Membership. This just did not happen. To those who could've but didn't - our thanks.

## PLANNING COMMISSION

The formation of the Planning Commission was brought into being as a result of a motion at the Annual Meeting in 1972.

A great deal of thought went into the initiation of the Commission and the inaugural meeting was held in the home of the Club Secretary early in February 1973. Attending this meeting were those who had agreed to serve, plus the Commodore and Past Commodore and observers. The following were the first Commissioners.

Esther Waring, Frank Macintyre, Andrew Beers, Charlotte Kindle, John Seally, Jim Strutt and Pat Evans, the latter representing the Commodore on the Commission.

The Commission had been structured to have on its membership both sailors and non-sailors and to have equal representation from the distaff

side of the Club, the male side, the intermediates and the Board of Directors, although the representatives of the Board could not accept office in the Commission.

Frank Macintyre was appointed Chairman-Secretary while Andrew Beers became Vice-Chairman.

Apart from one or two exploratory interviews with key Directors, pressure of business kept Frank from getting the exercise off the ground. Realizing that commitments would not ease the pressure Frank reluctantly resigned his double post in mid-summer.

In an endeavour to come to grips with the situation, Pat Evans took it upon himself to call a meeting early in September for the purpose of regrouping and making a start on terms of reference within which framework the Commission might be expected to operate.

At this meeting Jane Macintyre, Frank's wife, who had been asked to serve by the Commodore, was welcomed as a new Commissioner. John Seally subsequently accepted the position of Chairman and has provided the needed continuity, with the Commission now fully functional and he has reported that they are now deeply involved with detailed study of new recommendations and potential projects.

## FLEET CAPTAIN'S REPORT

The 1973 Sailing Season has been what a number of members have called it - one of the great ones. There were a number of contributing factors:

The weather for sailing was above average.

A, B & C Series Ribbon races were instigated, replacing the Regular series and thereby increasing the rewards for sailing participation.

An increase in membership brought more people and boats into the fray.

The development of junior sailing instruction is continuing to improve to the point where more juniors are winning major trophies.

Again this year two major regattas were held at the Club - the GRYC Invitational and the Thompson Trophy, (Area 10 Championships) - 30 boats competed in each event.

Junior sailing recognition is being increased by the awarding of the new Beers trophy this year for the first time.

This year the Area 10 Championship was won by one of our Junior sailors.

This year the Twenty-four Hour Race at Stormont was won by a team of GRYC Juniors.

For the future:

Recognition of Laser sailors, a new emerging fleet in the club, is rumoured to take place in 1974.

Recognition of out-of-club competitive sailing is to become tangible in 1974.

Above all else, I have enjoyed carrying out the task of Fleet Captain for the past two years, enjoyed being a part of the development of club sailing, working with delightful and enthusiastic executive colleagues, members and staff of the GRYC.

Good weather and assistance to our new Fleet Captain for next year.

## THE SNAVE TROPHY

In the belief that the future strength of the stripling club would rest squarely upon the shoulders and in the sinews of the younger members, the very first trophy presented to the Club was that which masquerades under the name of the SNAVE TROPHY.

It is awarded annually to the Junior who shows greatest all-round improvement in junior activities. But further, the Junior must have shown and maintained a good sense of sportsmanship, good behaviour and have provided on a continuing basis, service and regard for the well-being of the Club, known as esprit-de-corps.

Selection of the deserving Junior is made at the end of the season by the Junior Activities Committee, with the advice of the Instruction Staff. Usually the announcement of the winner's name, at the annual junior prize-giving, comes as a complete surprise to the recipient who generally has no conception that he or she is being considered.

The Junior picked to receive the honour in 1973 was CATHY KNIGHTS who accepted the trophy and "keeper" with becoming grace from the hands of the donor.

## NEW TROPHIES

During the past year three new trophies have been added to the Club. The first is the Beers Trophy for junior sailing, which is being awarded to the junior who shows the most promise in regular competition and has not received one of the junior sailing trophies. The Voyageur Trophy is the second. It will be awarded by the Strutt Family to a Albacore Sailor in recognition of his sailing abilities at regattas outside of the Club, i.e. a traveller's trophy. The third will be the Wood Laser Trophy, the terms of which will call for the winner to have participated in a minimum of fifty per cent of all GRYC races. This means that the other fifty per cent could be raced outside the Club.

CLUB MANAGER'S REPORT

Once again, after much scrambling and worry we have had a very successful summer. A great deal of the load was taken by our new employees. Thanks for all the help David, Dean, Chris and Marg.

Unfortunately because of the change in the CYA regulations we could not award any Gold Sail awards. I do not have a final breakdown of the swimming awards at the time of writing, hence their exclusion from this report, although I feel that Marg did a great job and had a very high pass rate. A very successful adult program was run on Tuesday and Thursday morning. The nine ladies and I had some interesting sailing and a lot of fun. I hope the interest and enthusiasm shows again next year.

On the maintenance side of things, a lot was accomplished, once again with the help of our employees.

A new junior dock and crash boat dock for the point was built. The clubhouse floor and deck were painted as well as the ladies changing hut. The boom and the picnic tables were pentoxed. The bridge between the islands was re-planked. The crash boat received a coat of red paint and the prams were fibreglassed in spots.

In addition to this the routine maintenance of the island was made much easier with more bodies to do it.

As far as the junior program goes, with our present staff, I feel that the maximum number of pupils to instructors in any level should be twelve.

With the present number of employees, possibly a more efficient use of them would be:

2 instructors - 5 days/week

1 maintenance and race officer

Tuesday to Friday afternoons and evenings

Saturday and Sunday afternoons

1 swimming instructor, 5 days/week, 8 weeks.

Once again, I wish to thank everyone for a very pleasant and fruitful summer both for me and the club.

## PROPERTY COMMITTEE REPORT

The property committee continued in its attempts to maintain the club facilities, but lack of funds hampered any major undertaking in 1973. Among the projects undertaken was that of rebuilding the chimney of the clubhouse and replacing some of the rotten clubhouse supports. Painting the clubhouse floor, as well as the ladies' changing room, and general maintenance chores kept the club manager busy all summer. Several dead elm trees were cut down and the general programme of keeping the islands tidy paid dividends. A new junior pram dock was built and proved very useful both for the repair and storage of boats, and as an outdoor classroom for instruction. A special crash boat dock was installed at the lighthouse point enabling the emergency boat to be readily available. Two general work parties were held, which were well attended, proving that work and good fun made a very successful combination.

With the help of René Gachnang a new pump was installed in the pump house, thus avoiding what might have been a major problem. In addition, the septic tank facilities were overhauled. It is hoped that next year will see some major renovations to our canteen with the addition of heavy wiring so that an electric stove can be installed. It is also planned to open up new picnic table areas on the north and west side of the islands.

We look forward to a larger budget allocation so that recommendations and suggestions of the Planning Committee can be incorporated.
